The Award has been an inspiration to millions of young people, encouraging them to change their lives since 1956. Participants design their own Award, set their goals, and track their progress. The Award plays a significant role in young people's lives outside of school by creating opportunities for them to be active, develop skills, focus on physical recreation, engage in voluntary service, and experience adventurous journey. The Award enables young people's achievements to be recognized worldwide and provides them with a unique international experience. Additionally, the Award helps young people inspire others and communities, while also aiding their personal growth. Young people who participate in the Award learn to be confident and solution-oriented. They develop communication, problem-solving, and leadership skills. As a result, they positively impact society in areas such as health, education, and employment.

The International Award for Young People – Türkiye is an international program that encourages young people aged 14 to 24 to set goals, achieve them, celebrate their successes, and make a difference in society, while supporting extracurricular education.

HISTORY OF THE AWARD

1956

The Award was first established and implemented in 1956 in the United Kingdom under the name "The Duke of Edinburgh's Award" by Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh.

1995

Turkey was introduced to the Award in 1995. The first implementers of the Award in our country were the Turkish-British Friendship Association and a few schools.

2001

The Youth Award Association was established by educators and representatives of non-governmental organizations who implemented the "International Award for Young People Program" within their own institutions, and the program began to be managed by the association.

2003

The Award began introducing and implementing the program to TIKAV scholarship holders and, with approval from the Ministry of National Education (MEB), in 7 provinces. During this period, the evaluation and certification of the implementation were the responsibility of the International Award Foundation.

2013

It was implemented under the name "The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award-Turkey" from June 1, 2013, to July 9, 2020.

2020

Since July 9, 2020, it has continued to be implemented under the name "International Award for Young People - Turkey" (IAYP-TR) under the representation of the Turkish Human Resources Education and Health Foundation (TIKAV).

MISSION, VISION AND GOALS

Vision



The goal is to introduce young people living in our country to the Award , support their multifaceted development, and contribute to raising successful and well-equipped individuals.

Mission



To ensure the necessary conditions for the implementation of the Award, promote the Award, and guide its application in a qualified manner within the framework of the Award's standards.

Goals



To enable every young person aged 14-24 in Turkey to participate in the Award. In 2024, increase the number of new participants starting the Türkiye Goals Award to 3,500. Increase the number of participants completing the Award in parallel with the number of participants starting the Award.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES



Individual

Participants design their own Award based on their circumstances, choices, and local conditions. They start from the category that suits them, and as long as they do not exceed the age limit, they can complete the Award within the time frame they choose.



Non-Competitive

Participation in the Award is an individual activity, and there should be no competition between participants.



Accessible

Participation in the Award is possible for every young person, regardless of gender, disability, social background, or status, with the right guidance and inspiration.



Voluntary

When individuals participate in the Award, they dedicate their free time of their own accord.



Developmental

Participation in the Award contributes to personal and social development. Individuals gain valuable experiences and life skills, develop their self-confidence, become more aware of their surroundings and communities, and grow into responsible young adults.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Balanced



The Award offers a balanced framework that leads individuals to participate in various activities, helping them develop their minds, physical awareness, and social consciousness.

Progress-Oriented



As participants progress through the categories, the Award requires more time, commitment, and responsibility.

Inspiring



The Award inspires individuals to push their limits. They are encouraged to set their own goals and earn the Award through their personal development.

Requires Determination



The Award requires determination and cannot be completed irregularly in a short period of time. Participants are encouraged to continue their activities even after earning the Award.

Enjoyable



It is intended that participants and Award Leaders find the Award enjoyable, satisfying, and beneficial.

Increase the number of new participants, particularly by ensuring the involvement of at-risk and disadvantaged communities/individuals in the Award.

REACH

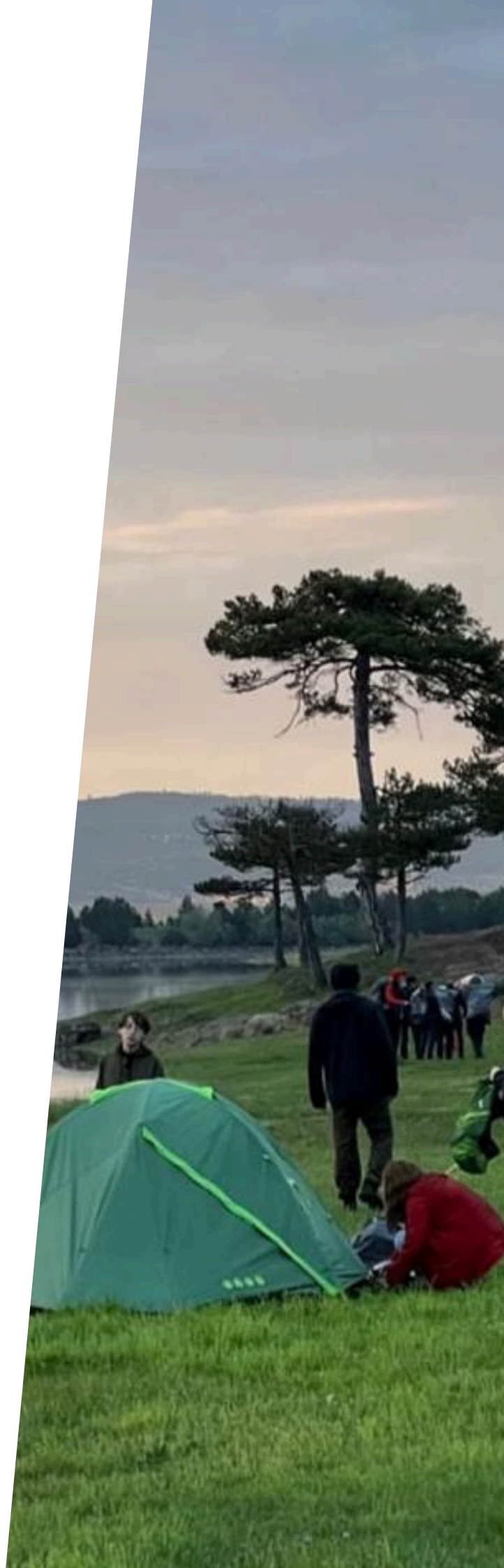
Enhance the social infrastructure of the Award by increasing the number of Award Centers and institutions providing the Award.

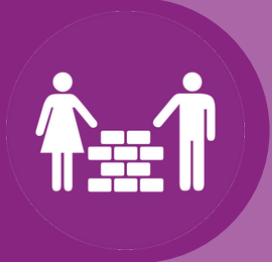

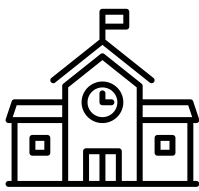

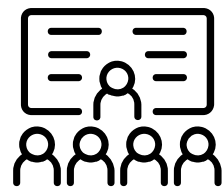

RESIDENTAL PROJECT:

WE BECAME CP AMBASSADORS; WE BUILT BONDS, NOT JUST DEVICES

IAYP-TR Gold Category Participants came together in the 2025 period for a meaningful project centred on social awareness. Implemented in collaboration with one of our strategic partners, SERÇEV (the Cerebral Palsy Children's Association), the project titled "We Became CP Ambassadors; We Built Bonds, Not Just Devices" enabled Gold Category participants to carry out field activities in Ankara, creating direct and tangible social impact.

Throughout the project, participants engaged with individuals with cerebral palsy and their families, going beyond volunteering activities to develop empathy, raise awareness, and strengthen their sense of social responsibility. Through direct interaction, they gained deeper insight into individual needs and built meaningful, lasting connections.

This experience not only supported participants personal development but also contributed to a stronger awareness of social inclusion and cohesion. The connections formed beyond perceived barriers clearly demonstrated the social impact dimension of the Gold Category process in a concrete and meaningful way.

RESIDENTAL PROJECT: HOPE AND SOLIDARITY WITH SERÇEV

OUTPUT



- Residential Project was implemented within the Gold Category in collaboration with SERÇEV.
- Participants engaged in direct interaction with individuals with cerebral palsy and their families.
- One-to-one meetings, device adjustments, and guidance sessions for families were carried out.

IMPACT



- Participants levels of empathy, awareness, and social responsibility were strengthened.
- Connections formed with disadvantaged groups increased awareness of inclusion and social cohesion.
- Volunteering evolved from short-term support into a model of lasting impact.

OUTCOME



- The Gold Category process was enriched through a stronger social impact dimension.
- Participants gained experiential learning through direct engagement in social responsibility.
- The programme's social impact approach and strategic partnership model were strengthened.

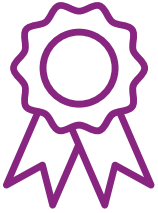
18–19 OCTOBER 2025 | FETHİYE

IGE & FORUM 2025 NIGERIA

17-23 NOVEMBER 2025 | NIGERIA

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Foundation and Nigeria National Authority hosted a significant global gathering focused on the worldwide development of the Award as part of IGE & Forum 2025, held in Lagos, Nigeria, from 17 to 23 November 2025.

Throughout the events in Lagos, approximately 200 young people from over 50 countries, alongside hundreds of volunteers and international stakeholders working in the youth sector, came together. As part of the programme, young people participated in an intensive three-day youth leadership programme, followed by the Award's triennial Forum, where discussions focused on expanding global access to the Award and identifying ways to engage more young people in this journey.

Over the past year, nearly 1.2 million young people in more than 130 countries have taken part in the Award Programme.



The Award brings together young people from around the world around shared values and a sense of global responsibility.



IGE & FORUM 2025 NIGERIA

The international gathering was also actively represented by The International Award for Young People – Türkiye. Our National Coordinator Leyla Nilüfer Yılmaz, Training Coordinator Kivanç Aker, and award holder Bora Tezkan, who successfully completed all three Award levels and qualified to participate in the International Gold Event (IGE), took part in sessions, strategic discussions, and Award Practice Visits held in Lagos. Within this scope, key topics such as youth empowerment, inclusion, accessibility, volunteer training, international cooperation, and enhancing the global impact of the Award were discussed. In addition, meetings with Award participants in Nigeria once again highlighted how the programme acts as a cross-cultural bridge, creating meaningful transformation in the lives of young people.



IGE & Forum 2025 powerfully demonstrated that the Award contributes not only to individual development but also to global social impact, solidarity, and a shared vision for the future.

CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS

The International Award For Young People – Türkiye is an international program that encourages young people aged 14-24 to set goals, achieve those goals, celebrate their success, and make a difference in society, supporting extracurricular education.

The Award is based on the principle of learning by doing and aims to equip participants with the essential 21st-century competencies that are required in today's workplace. In this way, it prepares them for social life and professional careers. The Award, with the training it provides, becomes one of the key elements employers look for in candidates' resumes, giving graduates an advantage in recruitment.

We collaborate with companies to offer Talent Development, Internship Programs, and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Projects. Throughout the project, we aim to increase the awareness of the Award in Türkiye and involve as many young people as possible in the Award. We also encourage employees from our partner companies to become Award Leaders (mentors). Currently, we are partnering with leading companies in their respective sectors. Such corporate partnerships are also common in international examples of the Award.
